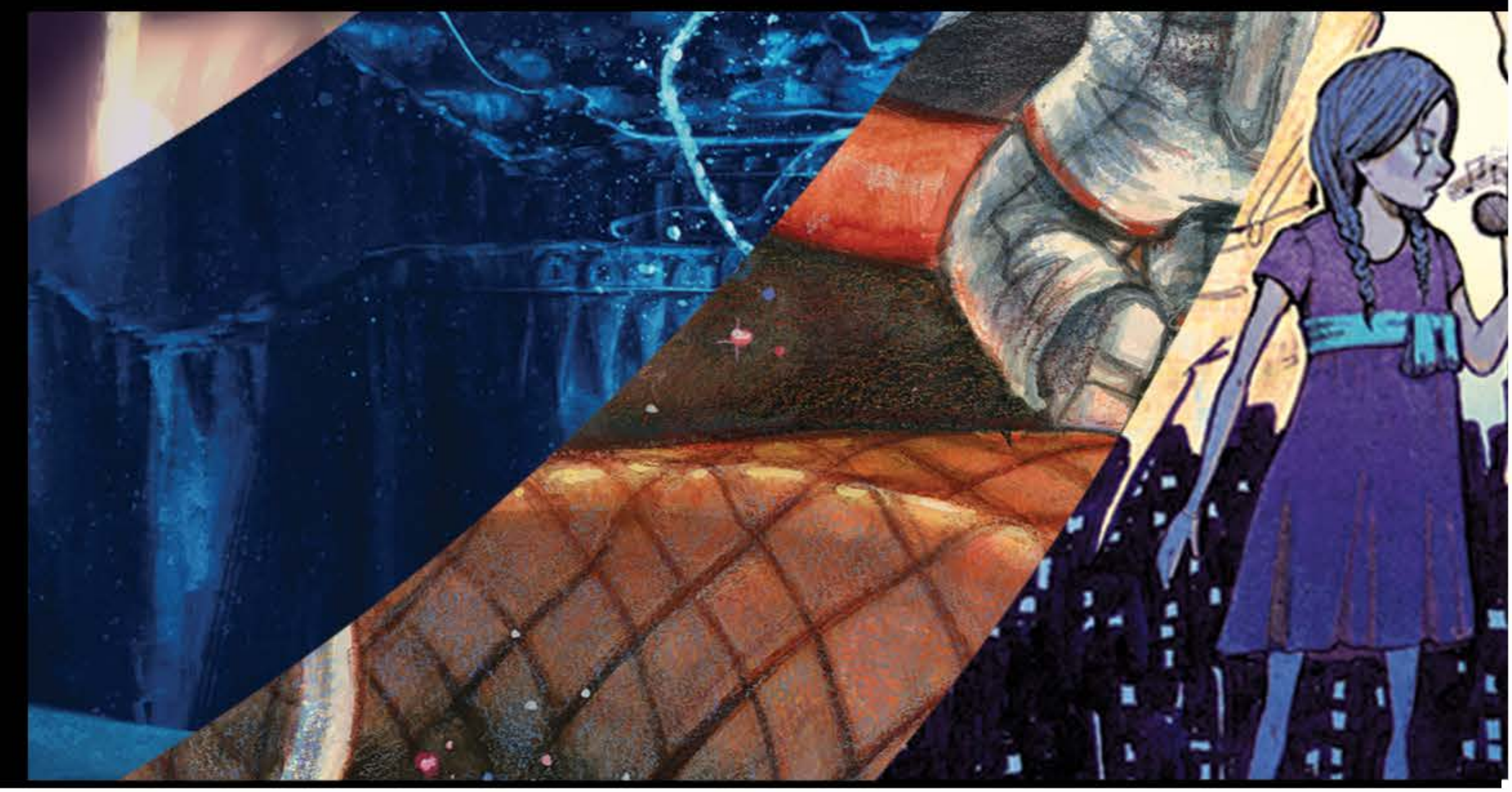

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Spring Internship

- ✍ Applications Open: September 15th
- ✍ Application Deadline: December 1st
- ✍ Referrer Deadline: December 15th

Fall Internship

- ✍ Applications Open: April 15th
- ✍ Application Deadline: July 1st
- ✍ Referrer Deadline: July 15th

Applicants are responsible for following up with their referrers to ensure Brink receives their letters of recommendation. If we have not received a letter of recommendation by the application deadline, we will notify your referrer that they have two weeks time to submit their materials.
